Born in Mendoza, Argentina, Eduardo Scarel has a M.Sc. degree in Atmospheric Sciences, a Ph.D. in Atmospheric and Oceanic Sciences (2006) from the Buenos Aires State University, and a Master's degree in Theology from the Buenos Aires Salesian Theology Institute (2005). He was granted postdoctoral fellowships from the National Scientific and Technique Research Council to do research in troposphere and stratosphere climate variability at the Argentine Pontifical Catholic University between 2006 and 2008. In 2006, Eduardo joined the Interdisciplinary Team for Studies in Climate, Economy and Peoples as a researcher, when the team was created and supported by the former Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio (now Pope Francis). He was appointed Director in the period 2015-2017. He is currently Chair Professor and Researcher at the School of Astronomy and Geophysics, State University of La Plata since 2014.

Eduardo is a member of the Coordinating Team of the Carmelite NGO from 2010, its representative at the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) from 2013, and member of its Executive Board. He was named by the Buenos Aires Engineering Council as "Honorable Member" (2016) for his commitment in issues of regional Climate Change. From 2016 Eduardo has been named member of the National (Argentine) Academy of Politics and Moral Sciences. In recent times, he is cooperating with the Global Catholic Climate Movement (Rome) and the Pontifical Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development.
